Collaborate Using your Free UIC Box Account

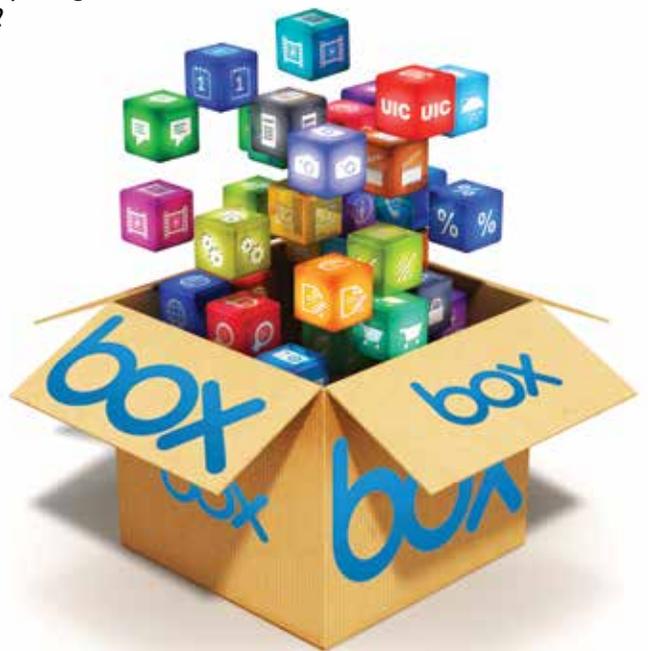
More than 36,000 University of Illinois students, faculty, and staff are already using Box to collaborate with anyone, anywhere, anytime. Are you one of them?

New Feature Preview for Blackboard Learn Upgrade

In the past year, the use of Blackboard at UIC has soared with over 26,000 students enrolled in 2,000 classes, taught by 1,500 instructors. We expect to see the increase in Blackboard use continue to rise with some of the exciting new features that will be part of the annual Blackboard Learn upgrade to be performed on Friday, December 19th, 2014.

Here's a preview of the top four features that will be available in the new release that are aimed at improving classroom efficiency:

- **New Student Preview**
Currently, instructors are able to view their class in Student Preview, but this feature will be greatly improved to maximize lesson planning. This is probably the most anticipated feature as it provides the capability for an instructor to see a class exactly how a student would see it. While in student preview mode, the teacher can interact with the class as if he/she were a student.
- **Anonymous/Delegated Grading**
Grading will be easier than ever for instructors with large courses (100+ students). When creating assignments, instructors can choose to enable Anonymous Grading, which will hide student names when viewing and grading submissions, or Delegated Grading, which will automate the grading process for the instructor and TAs. This will allow instructors to improve reliability and remove any bias in grading.
- **New Authoring Canvas for Portfolios**
This new release will offer the ability for students to convert course assignments into assignment artifacts that are available beyond the student's access to the course. The new function also offers the ability for instructors to formally require a portfolio as a submission to a course assignment.
- **Deeper SafeAssign Integration**
SafeAssign will more seamlessly integrate with Blackboard Learn assignments, which means separate SafeAssignments no longer have to be created. This updated feature will also include an updated originality report and the ability to handle multiple attempts and drafts.

If you haven't utilized the many features of Blackboard like uploading assignments, posting lectures, or streamlining your grading process, you're not too late! UIC IT Security Program Rollout

The UIC IT Security Program that was approved earlier this year by the IT Governance Council (ITGC), the Provost, and the Chancellors and Vice Chancellors Committee, will soon be rolling out across campus. This comprehensive program, developed by a subcommittee of the ITGC Infrastructure and Security Committee, includes security policy, standards, and guidelines that address data security issues in all campus units.

The program is multi-faceted and addresses data security issues such as data classification, access control, disaster planning, security awareness, as well as system and network security.

The subcommittee is in the process of contacting the college deans to request the designation of their Unit Information Security Officer (UIISO) who will be responsible for managing the program within their Unit.

Once the UIISOs are assigned, the three-year rollout timeline will begin. The program will be managed jointly by the UIC IT Security Program Committee and the UIC Chief Information Security and Privacy Officer, Ed Zawacki. Single Email System Provides Better Service



In an effort to improve email service, collaboration and scheduling at UIC, we are converting to a single email system.

In the coming months, we will begin converting all faculty and staff to a single email system using Microsoft Exchange email in the cloud, known as Office 365. Faculty and staff that are already using Exchange will not need to make any changes. For those of you receiving email through UIC Webmail or other mail systems at UIC, we will help you convert to Exchange.

For students, the single email system will continue to be UIC Gmail. However, we are requiring all students to retrieve their "@uic.edu" email via UIC Gmail. This change will provide a better, more reliable service and will help us guarantee that email is delivered. We started the process of helping students convert to UIC Gmail in September and expect to finish the transition later this fall.

Just like with the students, converting faculty and staff to a single email system will allow us to provide better service, better support, and the ability to guarantee the delivery of outgoing messages.
